The Holy Spirit is in all of us.

8th June, 2025 **Pentecost Sunday, Year C**



Fifty days after Easter we celebrate the events of Pentecost, when the Holy Spirit descended on the disciples who were gathered. They were alone, waiting and wondering. Jesus had ascended into heaven. Now, at Pentecost, there was the coming of the Advocate, the Paraclete, as promised by Jesus at the Last Supper before his death.

The Feast of Pentecost brings the liturgical season of Easter to a close. With the gift of the Holy Spirit to his disciples, the plan of salvation is brought to its conclusion.

On this day the Church came into being and, gifted with and inspired by the Holy Spirit, it now began its mission to proclaim "the marvels of God" (Acts 2:11) to the whole world.

The Book of Acts speaks in dramatic terms of the actual event of the coming of the Holy Spirit to the disciples. There was a mighty wind and tongues of fire and, much to everyone's astonishment, suddenly the disciples "were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech" (Acts 2:4).



I had the pleasure of being invited to an award ceremony for the Catholic Schools Maitland-Newcastle Diocese last weekend. It was inspiring to be present at such an auspicious occasion where excellence in education was celebrated and acknowledged. The leadership team of the Catholic Education Office spoke of the commitment of its staff across 58 schools. Common themes such as passion, drive, dedication, inspiration, and the expression 'over and above' were heard throughout the award ceremony. Bishop Michael Kennedy addressed the gathering as did highly respected priests and nuns. The Sisters of St Joseph's Lochinvar also presented an award as recognition of outstanding work in the Diocese. JUBILEE YEAR OF HOPE.

A Jubilee Year, or Holy Year, is traditionally proclaimed every 25 years as a time of grace, forgiveness, and spiritual renewal. It invites the faithful to embark on pilgrimages, seek repentance, forgive others, and deepen their relationship with God.

Rooted in the Hebrew tradition, Jubilees were celebrated every 50 years, marking the freeing of slaves and forgiveness of debts, as described in Leviticus. The first Christian Jubilee was proclaimed by Pope Boniface VIII in 1300, and since then, each Jubilee has been an opportunity for the faithful to experience God's mercy and receive a plenary indulgence.

The 2025 Jubilee, themed "*Pilgrims of Hope*," begins on 24 December 2024 with the Opening of the Holy Door of Saint Peter's Basilica and officially concludes in Rome on 6 January 2026, the feast of the Epiphany. The faithful are encouraged to embrace this Holy Year by participating in pilgrimages, prayer, eucharistic Adoration, and acts of repentance and charity, drawing closer to the limitless mercy of God.

St Paul, in his Letter to the Romans, then reminds us that, as followers of Christ, the Holy Spirit has made a home and dwells in each of us. St Paul describes how this indwelling radically transforms our very identity. It means that we are not just followers of Christ but beloved children of God and, as children, we are heirs! We are heirs with Christ, sharing the blessings of his resurrection.

St Paul urges us to live by the Spirit, for "everyone who is moved by the Spirit is a son of God" (Rom 8:14). It is the Spirit in us who teaches us to pray, "Abba! Father!"

Today's readings culminate with a text from John's Gospel reminding us of the role of the Holy Spirit in our personal daily lives and in the life of the Church. The Holy Spirit is an advocate who will guide us and remind us of all that Jesus taught. Jesus promises that "the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything, and remind you of all that I have said to you" (Jn: 14:26).

But John's Gospel tells us something even more profound when Jesus promises that "if anyone loves me he will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we shall come to him and make our home with him" (Jn 14:23).

This is grace: it is God, the Trinity of three divine persons, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, making their home in us, abiding in us, and, little by little, transforming us and conforming us ever more closely into God's image. Little by little we more clearly see the world and everything in it as God sees it. And the fruit of this grace in our lives is good works ... works for the coming of the Kingdom, works of compassion, hospitality and love.

The NSW Child Safe Scheme.



From 2012 to 2017 the Australian Government held a special inquiry called the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse. The inquiry looked at cases of child abuse in various institutions across Australia. It found that thousands of organisations had failed to protect children from abuse – or to report it properly when children or others raised concerns or abuse was identified.

The NSW Government responded to the Royal Commission by introducing new laws in February 2022. This was called the NSW Child Safe Scheme. The Scheme aims to make sure that organisations in NSW are doing everything they can to keep children safe from all kinds of abuse, including child sexual abuse – and to know what to do if it does happen.

Under these laws, it is now a mandatory requirement for religious bodies to comply with the Child Safe Scheme if they provide services to children, or if adults have contact with children in their Organisation.

While the Royal Commission looked at historical events, we are aware that child abuse still occurs in organisations, including some faith-based organisations. For this reason, organisations need to remain vigilant and ensure they have systems and strategies in place to prevent, detect and respond effectively to child abuse. This starts with organisations understanding 10 Child Safe Standards and practically applying them in their own settings.
